**Burbank** — Today City Council Candidate David Gordon submitted his Nomination papers and official Candidate's Statement at the City Clerk's office for the Special Election to be held January 24, 2006. Although only fifty signatures were required, Gordon's nomination papers contained 118 Burbank voter signatures gathered this past week. He is the first candidate to submit formal papers to qualify for this Special Election for the vacant City Council position.



While these documents were not officially due until October 28, Gordon said he wanted to get his campaign underway now rather than waiting until the last minute. "Since I announced my intentions to run, the good people of Burbank have been calling and dropping by my office to offer encouragement and support," he said.

A few enthusiastic supporters accompanied David Gordon to the Clerk's office. On hand was his campaign Treasurer, Gail Nicol, along with other friends and volunteers including Rose and Fred Prouser, Paola Morris, and former Burbank Airport Commissioner Phil Berlin.

Rose Prouser said, "In all the years I've known David Gordon I've always seen him as an advocate for the people. The causes he champions are the same ones we all care about -- the dignity of the individual, the quality of life in our neighborhoods, and an environment to support small business. I see him as a welcome and needed addition to the Burbank City Council."



"Burbank voters are demanding change. My purpose is to restore confidence, trust and hope to the voters. The status quo is just not good enough anymore. I have spoken out for neighborhoods, small businesses, homeowner property rights, and fought against overdevelopment, airport expansion, and traffic," Gordon said. He added, "It's time to put the people first, our neighborhoods first, and to support our small businesses. My only special interest is the public's interest." □
